It's an O'Brien trifecta at Brockville on Saturday night

BROCKVILLE-Racing has always been a family affair for Kingston's O'Brien family. However, Saturday night they took it to a whole new level at Brockville Ontario Speedway. Pat O'Brien claimed his first feature win of the season in the 358 Modified division at the Beast of the East with middle brother Danny in second and the youngest sibling Tim a strong third for a family sweep of the podium for the first time.

John Mulder got out to an early lead in the 30 lap event before Pat managed to track him down as his Bicknell was working extremely well on the low side of the race track. Danny, who came in as the points leader with 3 wins in the first four events meanwhile, started well back in the field and using a very high line around the quarter mile finally took over the second spot with about 5 laps to go. A late caution allowed for a three lap shootout, with Pat prevailing at the line by a car length. Tim meanwhile continued his solid season getting up to the third spot and following his brothers across the line for the trifecta. Adam Moore was the first non O'Brien in fourth spot followed by Todd Stewart.

The 25 lap Sportsman feature was an interesting scenario as well as Randy Gaudet passed his sponsor, Randy Earl, for the lead and then held off a late charge from teenager Shane Pecore for the victory. Early leader Luke Whitteker managed a third place showing in front of Chris Herbison and Matt Billings, who recovered from a quick pit stop for front end damage to charge back for fifth. The race was red flagged on the first lap after a multi car pileup on the back straight when the pole sitter got out of the shape sending four cars to the pits for the night. Sheldon Hoogwerf won the first Sportsman B Main of the season.

The Street Stock feature also had some family flair to it as Brian Billings claimed his first feature win going wire to wire and holding off a last lap challenge from Dominic Gauvreau. Brian's son Steve Billings was a strong third bringing some tears into the victory lane celebration. Bill Code and Guy Amesse rounded out the fast five.

There was also a first time winner in the 16 lap Rookie main as teenager Josh Kirkland scored his first feature win. Kirkland also led all the way and survived a late race battle with Benoit Laroche. Laroche tried everything but couldn't find a way past the go kart graduate. Chris Bakker continued his string of good finishes with a third with Leslie Turcotte-Mowat and Chris Lloyd in tow. John McNamee romped to a easy win over Clay McNamee and Paul Billings in the Vintage event.

Brockville Ontario Speedway returns to action, next Saturday night, June 27th with a complete race program plus the popular Kids Tire race and also the first mini enduro of the year. The green flag drops at 7pm.
