### LaFrance takes a Brockville classic Modified win

BROCKVILLE-Two of the most popular drivers at Brockville Ontario Speedway went toe to toe on Saturday night in a 358 Modified Classic at the Beast of the East. Stephane LaFrance and Danny O'Brien swapped the top spot back and forth numerous times in the final ten laps with LaFrance claiming his first 30 lap win at the BOS in two seasons on Ken Seymour Memorial Night. The results had everyone happy as many Brockville fans support both of these talented drivers.

The Little Hammer took over the top spot early with his self designed and constructed Modified creation and was able to pull away to substantial leads. That was until the Pocket Rocket arrived at the front of the field. The pair went wheel to wheel around the fast quarter mile oval with LaFrance at the top and O'Brien on the bottom. A small slip in turn two on the next to last lap clinched as LaFrance held on by less than a car length at the checkered flag. Bill Gill was third in front of Matt Billings and a hard charging Pat O'Brien who started dead last.

The Sportsman 25 lap main was a survival of the fittest affair, with caution after caution throughout. Chris Raabe's patience paid off for the second time this season as the Napanee pilot grabbed a relatively easy win. Early leader Chris Herbison was second with Sheldon Hoogwerf, Mike Mainse and Roger Varacalli rounding out the fast five. Chris wasn't the only Raabe in victory lane as uncle Todd drove to his second win of 2010. Raabe had a couple of early anxious moments but was able to drive to the front followed by Nich Gauvreau, Brock Cullen, Kevin Fetterly and Stephane Bussiere. Jean Marc Larose continues to be the dominant force in the Rookie division as he also won for the second time in three starts at the BOS. Chris Bakker was a strong second with Josh Kirkland, Nolan Swamp and Chris Lloyd, third through fifth respectively.

The first event of the Go Kart season took place last Wednesday night. Josh Kirkland opened things up with a victory in the Stock class. Other winners were the always fast Alex Blasko, Casey Neville, Jacob Clancy, Mitchell Roantree and Ryan McMillan. The Go Karts return to action this coming Wednesday night at 7 pm.
